BEST PRACTICE 1

TITLE OF PRACTICE - PATIENT CENTRIC CARE

Objectives:

- To promote patient-centric care and imbibe the spirit of virtuousness and service amongst the
- students.
- As a secondary health provider for multidisciplinary and advance oral diseases.
- To make oral health services available to the community in rural areas
- To inculcate an atmosphere of professional ethics in students and faculties
- To imbibe evidence-based approach in providing oral health care
- To promote experimental and participatory learning through community-based services.

Context

- In spite of a vast development in the health sector, our rural and sub urban areas still remain the most unreached areas in the health care services.
- A vast majority of this population still fails to seek treatment for oro-facial diseases due to lack of awareness regarding oral health issues or lack of means to seek timely intervention.
- Monetary issues also play a key role in seeking timely intervention amongst the community below poverty line and affordability of dental treatment still remains a major issue in oral health care in
- the general population.

Practices:

- Awareness of the masses regarding oral health is done through community and school camps.
- Tobacco cell has been established to provide awareness about tobacco related effects and
- counselling is provided to needy patients.
- Rallies have been conducted on 'No Tobacco Day', 'oral health day', 'world AIDS day', 'oral cancer day' to sensitize the general population towards the outcome of
- habits and timely treatment for various ailments.
- Our College and Hospital is associated with Mother Teresa hospital as a satellite center for
- providing services to the population in distant areas.
- Complete dentures are provided to the Geriatric population under the Dant Bhagya scheme.


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- Advanced treatment is provided including major surgeries for oral cancer, cosmetic surgeries, TMJ surgeries, trauma.
- The management provides funds towards payment of certain expenditures to reduce the financial burden.
- Mobile dental clinic is provided for appropriate dental health care during camps.
- Follow-up of patients are strictly maintained, and telephonic reminders are given where required.

Evidence of success

- 160 camps have been conducted with screening of 20612 patients, following visit of these patients to the hospital for further treatment. Patient seeking care for prevention and management of basic and advanced dental ailments.
- Routine dental procedures are performed with on par excellence. variety of special cases were treated in various specialties Total.632 special cases treated with advanced techniques.
- Out of 17 oral cancer cases 7 were operated with reconstruction procedures.
- Other surgeries undertaken include Oral submucous fibrosis, cleft lip and palate, TMJ, cysts and tumors including vascular lesions were treated with latest technology.
- Maxillary reconstruction with free fibula graft was done for Mucor mycosis case.
- Malocclusion cases were surgically corrected by osteotomy and genioplasty
- 346 potentially malignant disorders, ulcerative lesions, autoimmune disorders, orofacial pain conditions are all treated by innovative and evidence-based management strategies.
- 10 fungal infections were treated,100 behavioral counselling were done,60 CO analysis were done
- 38 Advanced periodontal regenerative procedures like root coverage, hemi section, root resection, bone grafting, GBR, and GTR procedures are undertaken, 10 micro gingival surgeries were done.
- Orthodontic treatment procedures which includes fixed functional appliances, orthopedic arch expansion, zygomatic screw placements for impaction of maxillary arch and current techniques like self-ligating, clear aligners and Pitts are also practiced.17 special cases were done, Ortho-Perio interdisciplinary cases are also done
- Special treatment procedures like nasal, eye and ear prostheses, obturators and fixed prostheses like Andrews, Maryland, Pierre abutments are undertaken for rehabilitation of maxillofacial region.
- 20 Dental implants were being made affordable to the masses and are undertaken as a routine procedure. Veneers are placed, CD with metal teeth were done, 4 indirect sinus lift,6 immediate implant, 3 tooth supported overdenture, zirconium bridge,3fibre post n core, cast n pour, smile designing, CD with neutral zone technique n cheek plumper,3 ridge -split, 3CD balancing cases, metal mesh complete denture were done.


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- To aid the final diagnosis of the disease the department of Oral Pathology and Microbiology has embraced the advanced techniques like Immunohistochemistry which aids in adequate and appropriate management of maxillofacial pathologies. Prompt services are provided from this department for evaluating safe margins during Onco surgical procedures.
- Root canal therapies are done with the state of art equipment like Endodontic surgical microscope.
- 19 Complete dentures n 20 removable were provided to patients under Dant Bhagya scheme on a regular basis.

Problems encountered and resources required

College runs under the charitable trust and therefore cannot charge the required amount for the treatment procedures. Hence, more financial resources to be mobilized through the different government schemes for the welfare of patients of socio- economically backward Kalyan Karnataka Region.

BEST PRACTICE 2
